I have also brought on board another small local business – Knots and Niggles massage who provide fortnightly remedial massages for the team, which has been accepted with great enthusiasm. It not only relieves sore achy muscles, it keeps them feeling valued. Keeping myself fit and active is an essential part of my day. I feel positive, alive and motivated from keeping myself fit and healthy. My team and my family rely on me to motivate and inspire them, so I practice what I preach. I need to clearly show who my authentic self is, and to strive to be my best, so I can inspire the best out of the team. As their Manager, they know I value them and I've got their back.



#### **BUSINESS SUSTAINABILITY**

The world is ever evolving and so is the HVAC + R industry. We believe in the importance of continually educating ourselves, to think ahead and be innovative. With our cutting-edge knowledge and experience in HVAC engineering, we give our customers the latest energy saving technologies, and are committed to the sustainability of our environment.

We are keen members of the newly formed Waste Wise Business group in Cairns, as we aspire to higher standards within our business to comply with applicable environmental laws. One proactive step we make is our Refrigerant Recovery Solutions for disposing of end of life equipment. We ensure that ozone depleting refrigerants are recovered responsibly and refrigerants are returned to the wholesaler for destruction. We all know well, and are being constantly educated on green house emissions, and the release of ozone depleting substances (refrigerant) therefore the safe recovery of refrigerants to reduce the effects of global warming is important for our future. This is why I educate the public by advocating to check your contractors licences, to look for the ARC tick. The tick identifies tradespeople that hold their National Refrigerant Trading Authorisation. This means refrigerant is only to be handled by licensed technicians. It frustrates me that unqualified and unlicensed people compromise this vital industry and endanger our environment.

Another way we actively care for our environment is through recycling copper and disposing of old air conditioners to FNQ recycling, where they are pulled apart for scrap.

Living in the tropics means air conditioning is not a luxury, but rather a necessity for our daily comfort, particularly in our summer months. With high use and without regular maintenance your air conditioner can become a hot bed for mould, bacteria and other air borne contaminates. They then potentially become less efficient, costing you more and often requiring repair and or replacement sooner rather than later. Would you drive your car for 5 years and never service it?

Traditionally strong chemicals are used to strip the air conditioner of these contaminates. For me having my family and staff breathing these chemicals didn't feel right. If they are not right for my family, they are not right for my customers. This motivated me to investigate and research about mould, the illnesses you could contract and explore another way, a better solution.

Undertaking this research led me to another small local business, My Habitat, located in Milla Milla. They have a product called mould master which is toxin free! I tested this product for a period of 6 months and was very happy with the results. Mould Master kills the mature mould cells, inactivates the spores so mould cannot grow. I have now collaborated with My Habitat and we use this product for hydro cleaning air conditioners. Furthermore, I have an agreement with My Habitat to supply our customers with small bottles of mould master with my business label on them. It has been such an exciting time with raising awareness of the hidden contaminates in our air conditioners and to educate our customers of the importance of regular maintenance. There are many other businesses in Cairns that have recently started promoting the hydro cleans, but which are expensive and generally toxic. While I acknowledge this is a sustainable income stream for the business during our slow period (winter) I believe it is vitally important to provide services that supports the positive health and wellbeing of our customers. I have chosen to offer this alternative, affordable yearly clean for our customers, and not follow suit with other businesses. I love the fact that I have collaborated with another local small business in our community to use their toxin free product. That's a win for local business, a win for our customers, and a win for the environment.

My mission and leadership role in our business is to increase our presence, both in the domestic and commercial market, by gaining further maintenance contracts through education and awareness of our cutting-edge, environment friendly services to our customers. I plan to have two fulltime tradesmen and employ a young person to join me in the office. I feel this goal is not too far away.
